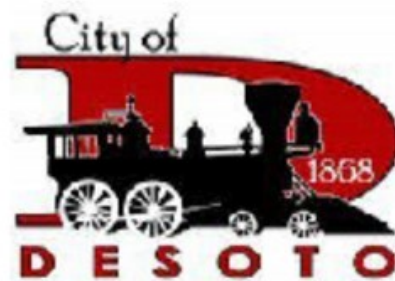

De Soto's Cleanup Day is a great opportunity to rid yourself of unwanted items that won't fit in the trash can. Depending on when you put it on the curb, your "trash" may become someone else's "treasure." If you're "shopping," thanks for being considerate.

Here are some guidelines to help you plan for Cleanup Day.

Acceptable Materials:

General Household Waste (Trash)

Furniture

Mattress

Grill (no tank)

Bicycles

Patio Furniture

Bulky Items: Boxes, Crates, Clothing, Tables, Cabinets, etc.

Construction Debris: Less than 5 feet long, no exposed nails

Carpeting: Cut to 4-foot lengths and properly bundled

Non-Acceptable Materials:

Electronic Waste: Computers, Televisions, and related accessories

Tires

Automobile Parts

Batteries

Fluorescent Light tubes or fixtures

Appliances

Yard Waste: Leaves, grass clippings, vines, vegetative matter, limbs, twigs, branches

Liquid Waste: Oils, Anti-Freeze, Paint, Thinner

Any Hazardous waste or Chemical waste

Any Biohazardous waste

Any Medical or potentially Infectious waste

Concrete

Railroad Ties
